SAS – State testing in the content area of Science will take place in May. The eleventh grade will test May 21<sup>st</sup>.

SAS-State testing in the content areas of English Language Arts (ELA)/Writing, Mathematics and Science will take place May 1<sup>st</sup> –May 3<sup>rd</sup> for grades six through eight.

AP EXAMS - Payment for AP exams are due at your earliest convenience to the guidance office. The test cost is \$44 per test, payable to SMHS. The English Literature exam will be held on May 8<sup>th</sup>, US History exam on May 10<sup>th</sup>, Biology exam on May 13<sup>th</sup>, Calculus exam on May 14<sup>th</sup> and English Literature exam on May 8<sup>th</sup>.
