SENIOR PLANS 2021

- 68% of graduating students plan to attend four year colleges/universities in majors that vary from the Health Sciences, Industrial and Game Design, Engineering, Education, Business and Forensic Science. Their plans will carry them to the shores of North Carolina, the plains of South Bend Indiana, the deserts of Arizona, the mountains of Colorado and many students are taking advantage of our local state resources.
- ♦ 19% of graduating students will pursue two year degrees and certificate programs to become veterinarian technicians, auto mechanics, welders, fire fighters and emergency workers.
- 10% of the graduating class will enter the workforce as aspiring entrepreneurs, laborers and custodians.
- ♦ 3% of the graduating class will proudly serve in the United States Military.

- High school student attendance is only required for periods when students have exams, beginning Tuesday June 8th.
- Exam grades will count as follows (credit is only offered for passing final averages):

Semester Course

1st marking period = 45% 2nd marking period = 45%

Exam = 10%

Year Long Course

1st marking period = 22.5%

2nd marking period = 22.5%

Exam = 5%

3rd marking period = 22.5% 4th marking period = 22.5%

Exam = 5%

- Students who are tardy more than 5 minutes will not be allowed to take the exam during the scheduled period.
- Any student who is absent during an exam period must have a parent (guardian) call the school before 9:00 a.m. the day of the absence. No make-up exam will be allowed without the permission of the administration.
- Students must stay in the room for the entire exam period.
- Students on the school grounds who do not have an exam period must be in the cafeteria or library, both of which be quiet areas. Only students who have a make-up exam should be on school property after lunch.
- Lunch will be provided for high school students at 11:30 each day during the exam period.
- Students must turn in their books or pay for lost books before taking the exam.
