JUNIORS-CLASS OF 2023

Junior meetings with Mr. Cooney will be completed by the February break. Juniors will meet one on one to start planning and researching post-secondary opportunities, and to plan for the Job Shadow/interview experience as part of the Senior Project.

- Develop a list of potential schools
- Make plans to visit potential schools in April
- Review results from the PSAT available online
- Prepare for the SAT (March 23-30) using Khan Academy
- Consider senior year course selections in March
- Complete a Job Shadow/interview as outlined by the Guidance Department
- Attend the Junior College Planning Night to be held in April

SAT (MARCH 23 - 30)

The New Hampshire Department of Education (NHDOE) will use the SAT as the statewide assessment test for juniors. Students in the 11th grade will take the test for free.

Highlights

- The New Hampshire SAT test day is March 23-30, 2022. Actual day TBD.
- The SAT will be given at school during regular hours and will be free to all 11th-graders.
- Free practice at Khan Academy. This will be facilitated on the guidance day in February.
