SENIOR PLANS 2022

This year's graduating class will move on to new and exciting challenges.

- ♦ 61% of graduating students plan to attend four year colleges/universities in majors that vary from the Health Sciences, Engineering, Education, Business and Music Production. Their plans will carry them all over New England, Georgia, New Jersey, out west to Colorado and Utah, and as far east as Scotland.
- ♦ 26% of the graduating class will enter the workforce as aspiring entrepreneurs and laborers.
- ♦ 13% of graduating students will pursue two year degrees and certificate programs to become auto mechanics and electricians.

This year's graduation ceremony will once again take place at the Mount Sunapee Resort in Newbury NH at **6:00pm** on **Friday June 10th**.

JUNIORS-CLASS OF 2023

Junior students should continue working and thinking about their future. At this time juniors should:

- 1. Complete their job shadow, or be scheduled to complete the job shadow.
- 2. Have their SAT scores and consider retaking the SAT or taking the ACT next fall.
- 3. Use Xello online and visit schools of interest or meet with military recruiters .
- 4. Register for appropriate coursework next school year.
- 5. Consider summer enrichment in their area of interest.

SCHEDULING FOR 2022-2023

Final drafts schedules for the 22-23 school year are almost complete and will be included in the final mailing of the 21-22 school year. Students should resolve any placement issues with the Guidance staff: Grades 9-12 – Mr. Cooney, Grades 6-8 – Mrs. Watkins. The guidance department will audit senior schedules to ensure they will meet graduation requirements and will reschedule students who fail a class. However, students are responsible to arrange for summer school, or alternative credit. Guidance personnel will be available until June 22nd, periodically throughout the summer, and will return August 15th to answer any questions or concerns you might have.

TESTING

- ◆ The NWEA testing scores (administered beginning the week of May 31st) will be sent home in the final mailing with report cards. You should be able to track your student's academic progress in the content areas of reading and mathematics throughout this school year with the information provided in the final mailing. - ◆ Statewide SAS testing (Juniors) in the content area of Science will take place May 17th.
