SENIOR PLANS 2023

This year's graduating class will move on to new and exciting challenges.

- ◆ 73% of graduating students plan to attend four year colleges/universities in majors that vary from the Health Sciences, Engineering, Education, Business and Studio Art. Their plans will carry them all over New England, Georgia, New Jersey, Virginia and Montana.
- 12% of the graduating class will enter the workforce as aspiring entrepreneurs and laborers.
- 9% of graduating students will pursue two year degrees and certificate programs to become auto mechanics and electricians.
- 6% of the graduating class will enter the Military

JUNIORS-CLASS OF 2024

Junior students should continue working and thinking about their future. At this time juniors should:

- 1. Complete their job shadow, or be scheduled to complete the job shadow.
- 2. Have their SAT scores and consider retaking the SAT or taking the ACT next fall.
- 3. Use Xello online and visit schools of interest or meet with military recruiters .
- 4. Register for appropriate coursework next school year.
- 5. Consider summer enrichment in their area of interest.

SCHEDULING FOR 2022-2023

Final drafts schedules for the 23-24 school year are almost complete and will be included in the final mailing of the 22-23 school year. Students should resolve any placement issues with the Guidance staff: Grades 9-12 – Mr. Cooney, Grades 6-8 – Mrs. Watkins. The guidance department will audit senior schedules to ensure they will meet graduation requirements and will reschedule students who fail a class. However, students are responsible to arrange for summer school, or alternative credit. Guidance personnel will be available until June 20th, periodically throughout the summer, and will return August 14th to answer any questions or concerns you might have.

TESTING

- The NWEA testing scores (administered beginning the week of May 30th) will be sent home in the final mailing with report cards. You should be able to track your student's academic progress in the content areas of reading and mathematics throughout this school year with the information provided in the final mailing. - Statewide SAS testing (Juniors) in the content area of Science will take place May 16th.

The finals are scheduled for June 9th – June 14th. The Middle School will continue on a **normal seven period schedule** during the exam period. The High School schedule is as follows:
